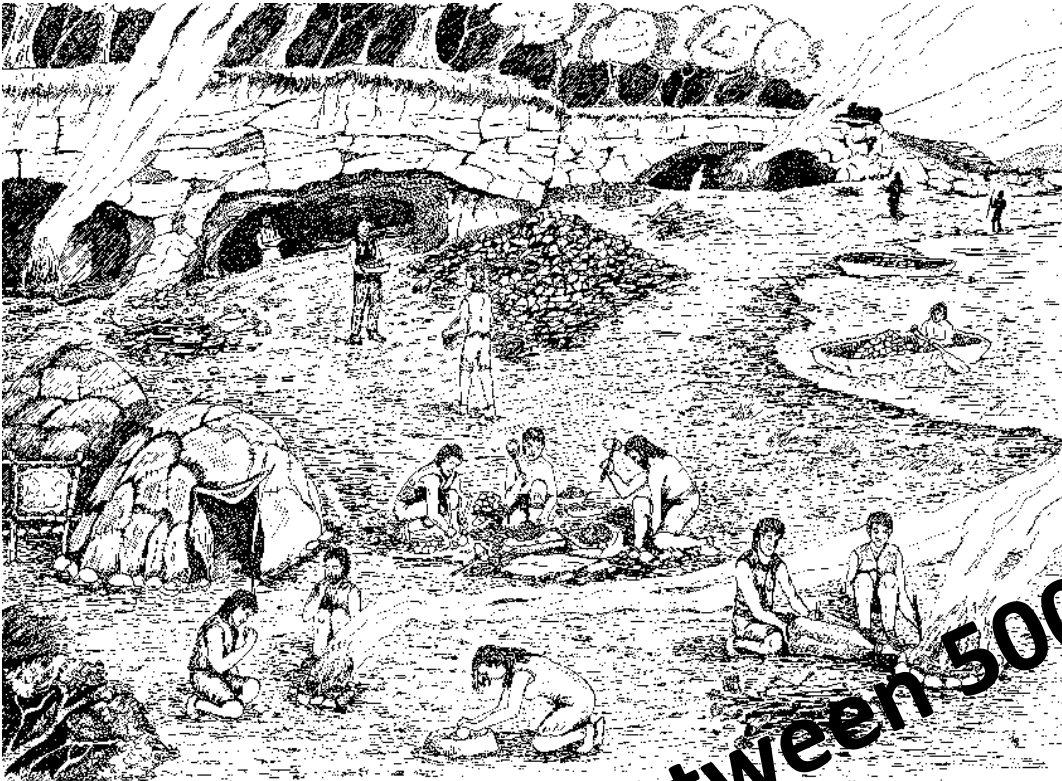

- Culture flourished in Henan, Shaanxi, and Shanxi



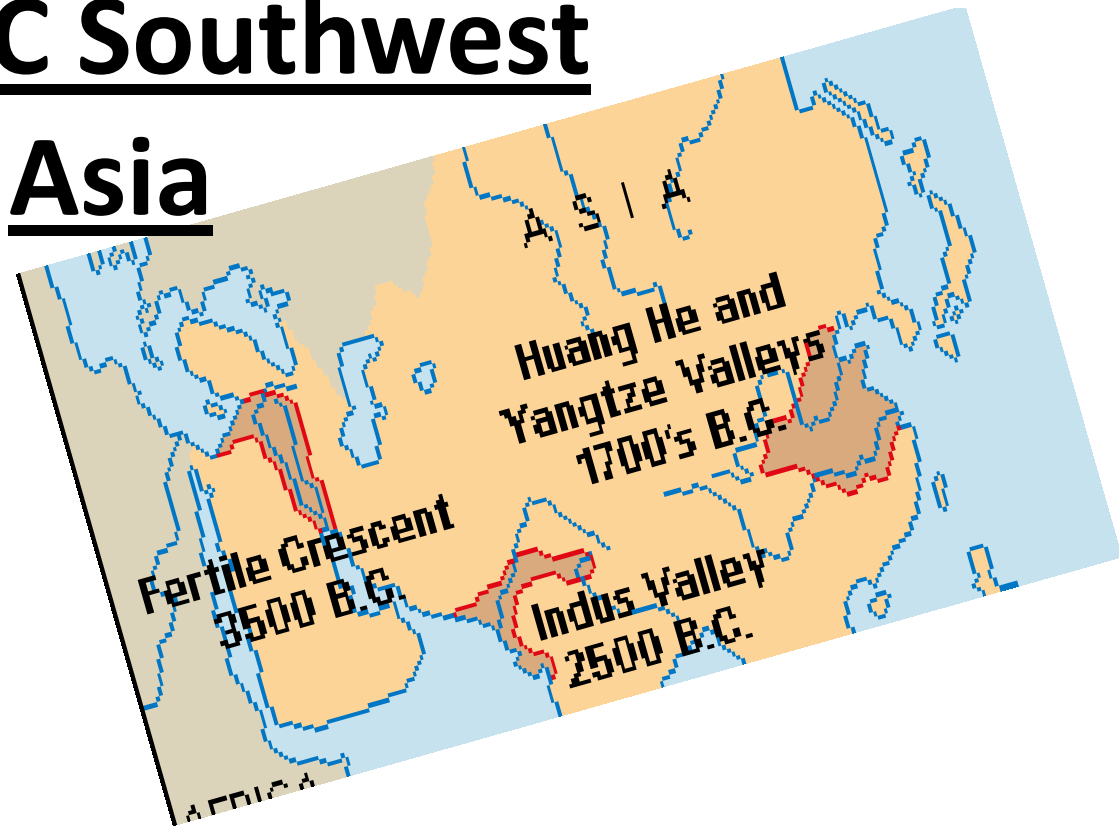


Yangshao Culture

Minoan Pottery

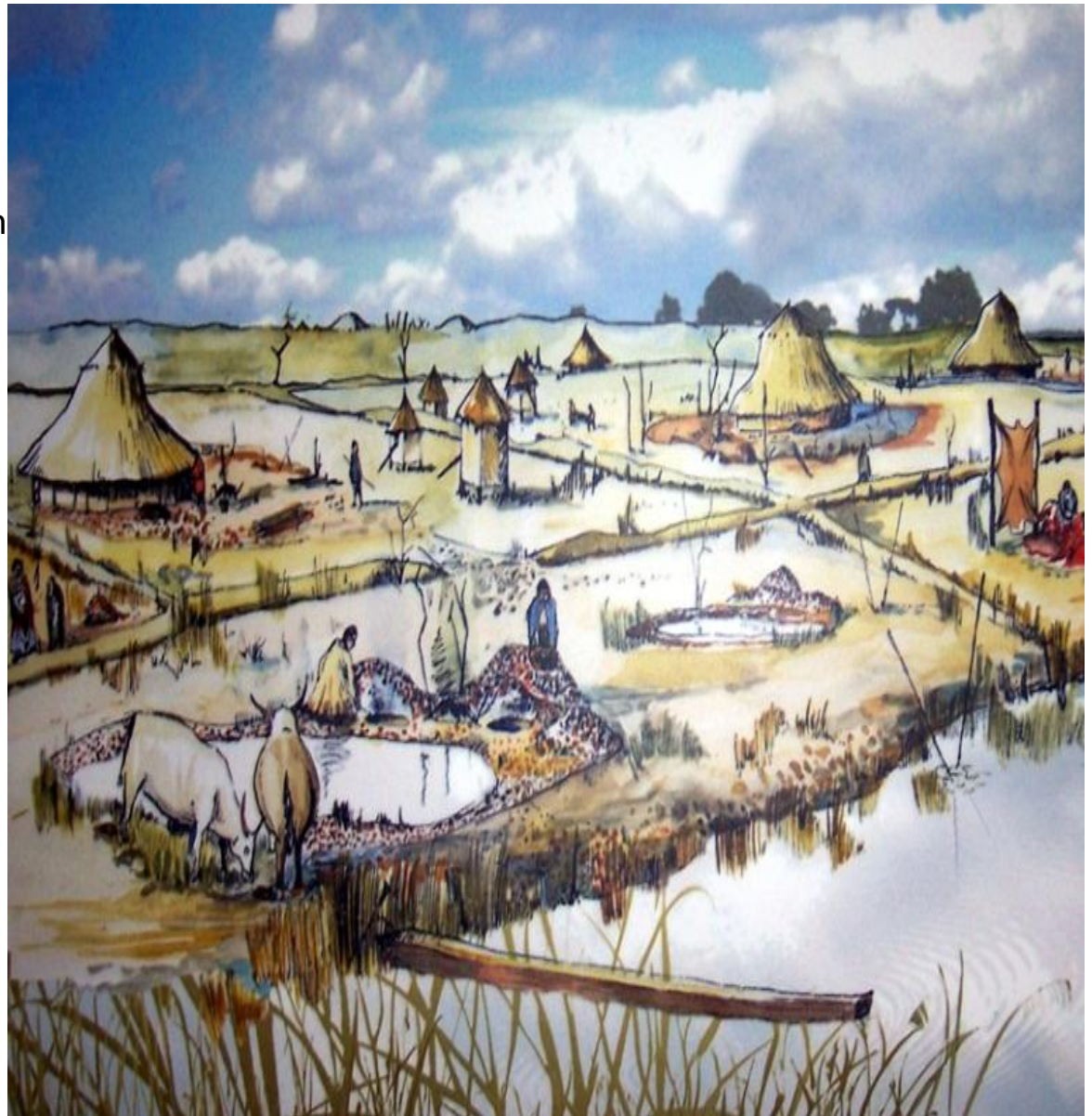


What most people in the Minoan civilization made. High number of pottery production

- ❖ Crete showed promise of greatness

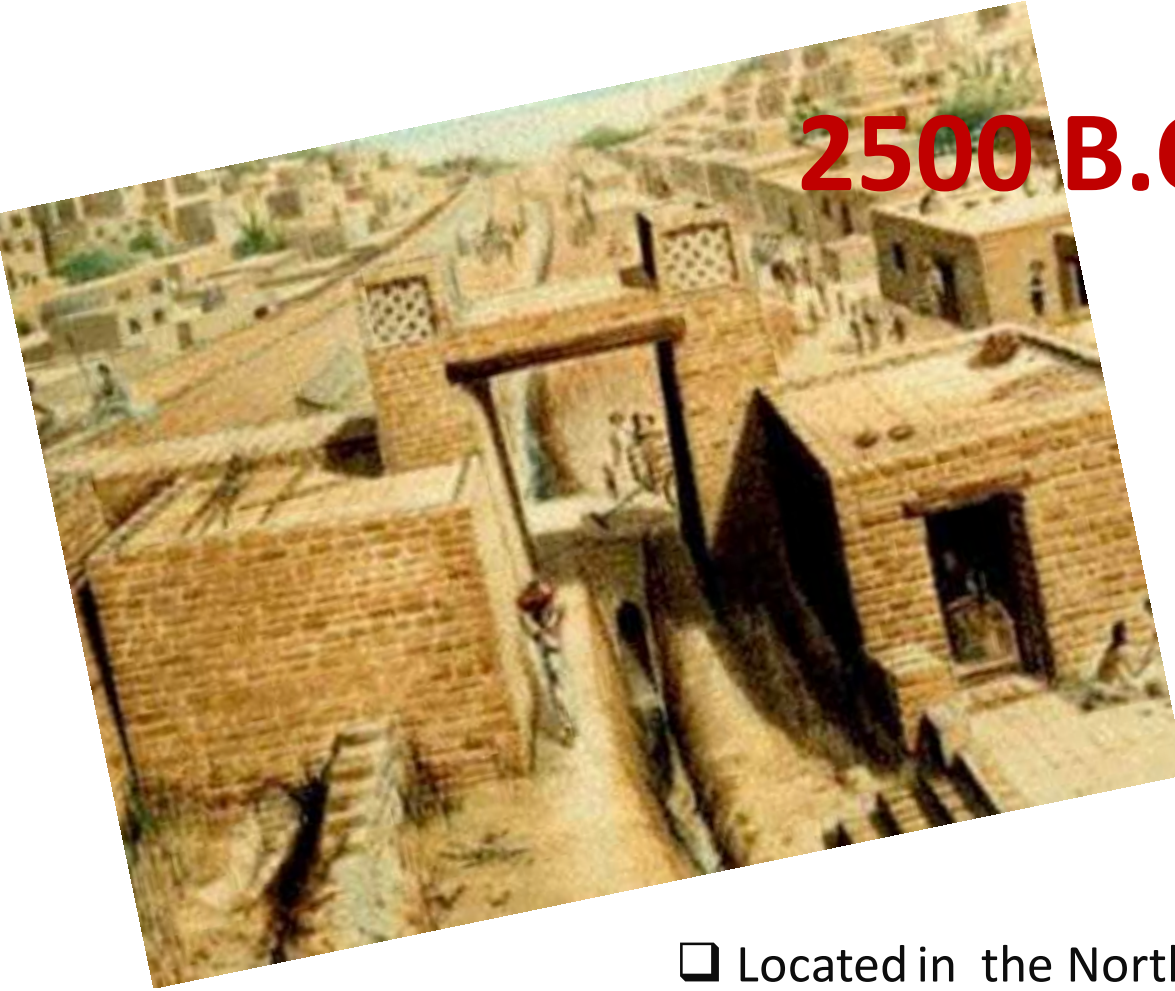


Bronze Age
